Message from the Headmaster

As we reach the end of the first term I want to express my heartfelt gratitude to the administrative, support and teaching staff for all their hard work. Thank you for creating an environment that is safe and nurturing for the young men of Graeme College. It is by no means without its challenges, and often thankless, but the love and dedication that goes into every day is remarkable.

Our aim is never to not just survive, but to thrive - and it has been wonderful to see the myriad ways in which your boys have responded so positively.

With the COVID-19 pandemic, many of the departmental annual teaching plans (ATPs) were revised. These were implemented from a teaching point of view from the beginning of the year. The school has to use a departmental reporting system known as SA-SAMS to generate termly reports. While the ATPs were put in place, the SA-SAMS curriculum model was not updated to match these in time.

We have been advised to hand out reports early next term by the Department of Education. The staff, however, are

very aware that the holiday often provides a useful platform for the discussion of marks with your sons. This is particularly true for the boarders, many of whom live far away.

Parents / guardians you will be getting a report this term, but it has been generated by the staff. This means that some of these marks are subject to change, as the weightings for different tasks have not been fixed yet. This report will, however, give our parents an idea of how your sons have fared this term.

Often the results for Term 1 are quite inflated, as the body of work is still relatively small. This means that if your son has not met the required minimum standard, it might be an early warning sign that he is struggling and may require some extra support.

The SA-SAMS reports will be generated as soon as the new curriculum patch is ready to be loaded. These reports will be made available to you early next term. The SA-SAMS report will be the official Term 1 report.

To all our families, whose support we rely on, and to the teenagers who fill our days with laughter, and sometimes tears, enjoy the short break and come back refreshed and ready to tackle a busy second term. I wish you all a well-deserved rest during which you all can do things that feed the soul and bring restoration to the mind and body.

As from Monday 3 May 2021 all boys must wear a tie to school every day.



The academic programme has been developed to include many individual music learners, focusing on instruments that include piano, guitar, drums and marimba. The FET subject music programme consists of 25 learners from Grade 10 to Grade 12.

The steelband and marimba groups have restarted ensembles for the different age groups and grades, with careful thought placed on limitations surrounding the space in the rehearsal venues. The boys have been working hard on building repertoire and technical skills in their groups. Their participation encourages the personal development of social skills, group work and musicianship. We are also hopeful of restarting the choir programme from Term 2.





The Grade 9s wrote inspirational quotes during English with Miss Hiscock to end a productive term.










Grade 11s
