Message from the Headmaster

During the past two weeks, the realization dawned on me, yet again, that teaching is not easy, and it never will be. At the moment, teachers are trying to strike a balance between ensuring that all our boys have covered the required work, while also managing academic assessment pressure and continuing with cultural and non-contact sporting activities under the new normal.

In a comic strip cartoon Peanuts, “Charlie Brown” shoots an arrow at a fence and then proceeds to draw a circle around the arrow. When Charlie Brown is asked why he only draws the target after he shoots, Charlie responds by saying “if you do it my way, you never miss!”

Much like Charlie Brown in the cartoon, many of our boys’ approach end of term assessments in this manner. (they do not clearly define the target)

It is thus important to encourage your sons to “draw the target BEFORE they shoot the arrow”.

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Drawing the target at which we aim our proverbial arrow is the setting out of good action plans outlining all the necessary steps to achieve one's goals that will help reach the intended target.

The trick is not only to think clearly about the end goal, but to also consider the different steps to get there and the likely and potential obstacles along the way.

Next week will be an ideal opportunity for our learners to evaluate their commitment and belief in their pursuit of academic excellence as they prepare for the mid-year assessments.

If you can identify your targets with crystal clarity, you will be amazed at how often you will hit the mark.

Two weeks have been set aside for all of this term's formal assessments for Grades 8 -12. The purpose of these assessments is multi-fold. In the case of the Grade 8s - 11s this will form part of this year's standard assessments from which these young men might gauge how well they might do at the end of the year. For the Grade 12s, the assessments have been devised so that these learners can get an idea of what is expected of them for the preliminary examinations next term. With the haphazardness of last year, we would like to ease them into this process as the preliminary examinations count enormously towards their year mark and they therefore need to do as well as possible in these exams. A copy of the assessment timetable is available with this newsletter. Boys will need to report to their respective screening areas at 07h30 each morning. They will then be lead to their respective venues. They should be collected after the completion of the day's assessment so that preparation for the next day's assessment can take place. Please note that the Grade 8s and 9s will have normal school on 17 and 18 June. The commencement date for their examinations is on Monday 21 June.

Absence from school - Covid 3rd Wave:

With the rise in COVID-19 cases around the country, we ask that parents be vigilant and monitor their children for the real COVID symptoms. Should they present symptoms, please take them to the doctor and have them avoid attending school. Please can you continue to report when your son will be absent from school, as it makes monitoring easier.

Grade 9 Natural Science Assessment:

The Grade 9s will need to write the results of their experiments from this week up in the form of an assessment over the course of this weekend. The hand in date for ALL Grade 9s will be Monday 14 June.

Warm and sunny winter days call for exercise outside! The Junior School boys were hard at work this week practicing for inter-house cross-country.



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
Round-the-Mountain relay

Grade 7 English Dialogue Orals this week saw some fantastic work from the boys.





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Grade 9s

The SPCA stands for: The **Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals**

The great **Mahatma Gandhi** is quoted as saying:

"The greatness of a nation and its moral progress can be judged by the way its animals are treated".

South Africa has a poor record in terms of how animals are treated.

Services provided by the SPCA:

- Medical attention for sick/stray animals.
- Sterilisation of animals to prevent mass breeding.
- Provide support in the outbreak of serious illness amongst animals like RABIES.
- Adoption of homeless animals to get them off the streets and into good homes.
- Prevention of cruelty to animals.
- Legal prosecution of offenders found guilty of cruelty to animals.
- Offer support to poor communities in terms of feeding, vaccinating, sterilizing etc.

The SPCA only receives money from the local Municipality to function: They no longer receive this money.

How does it affect us if the SPCA has to close its doors?

- Animal to human transfer of serious illness like RABIES can occur if no intervention by the SPCA.
- Mass breeding of dogs/cats as no sterilization. Who will look after them?
- Mass outbreaks of disease amongst animals as no vaccinations will be offered to poor communities.
- No one to prevent humans from abusing animals.
- No one to rescue abused animals.
