Message from the Headmaster

The onset of the pandemic saw everyone scrambling to find alternative ways to get things done in the "new normal". Schools and businesses have had to take creative leaps to help them adjust to an entirely different world while disrupting their own thinking for more innovative gain.

Exploring creative outlooks is not a new concept. Whenever we think of creativity, the first thing that comes to mind is painting, singing, dancing, etc. However, there is a lot more to the concept than just that. Creativity is more about skill than inborn talent, and it is a skill parents can help their children develop. Creativity has become essential across every industry and sector, and our children are going to have to tap into their creative mindsets to face the challenges as well as to seize the opportunities that will arise. It is thus very important that we nurture and build on the imagination and especially the skill of creative writing and thinking in our children.

Children need constant stimulation to always create curiosity in them, and to keep them craving more information. Reading and writing are closely tied. It is important that a child finds an interest in reading and writing at a young age before they lose interest in it. Bad experiences can also have a negative effect on a child's reading which, in turn, has a detrimental effect on the child's writing and creativity. In addition to you reading to your children, if your child is old enough, have him read to you. Pose questions to your child about their favourite books. Why do they prefer certain novels over others? Assist children in developing their reading tastes and let them think critically about words, characters, settings, and stories.

A massive way to support a child's development of creativity is to put some of their work on display. Children love to see their work around their home as they feel as though people are proud of what they have done and are congratulating them indirectly.

In conclusion, it is important to emphasize the process rather than the product. One way you can do this is by asking questions about the process – Did you have fun? Are you finished? What did you like about that activity?

By helping to develop the creativity in our children we are preparing them for new adventures, divergent ideas that they will have to share and thus participate in many other academic activities.


