# Message from the Headmaster

The new group of senior 2022 portfolio heads were inducted on Wednesday. We congratulate this group of young leaders, wish them all the best and wish them success in their new leadership roles. It is important for our boys to experience leadership opportunities as this will assist with the art of building relationships within committees and providing opportunities to learn to identify and display effective communication and interpersonal skills.

The author Robin Sharma reminds us that leadership is not about a title, but rather about a behaviour. Leadership is even more difficult when you are trying to lead your peer group. "It takes great courage to stand up and be counted. Being one of the sheep in the flock is far easier than being the herdsman". Young adults find this leadership role the toughest of all challenges, because often what the crowd wants, is actually not the correct way forward.

Aristotle said: "To lead an orchestra, you must turn your back on the crowd."

Character and a leadership culture are fundamental to effective leadership. Good character builds trust and, without trust, people will not follow you. Leadership culture is the way people interact, make decisions and influence others.

If we understand that our school character and leadership culture is a set of values, beliefs and assumptions shared by learners, staff and parents, we can then deduce that we as a school have a significant influence on attitude and behaviour. Management can influence this culture, but cannot control it.

Together, parents and educators at Graeme College must strive to enable our learners to reach their full potential by developing a strong character and leadership culture that will make a positive and meaningful influence in our community and society. That is the importance of a real South African school like Graeme College.



#### Art



All entries will be adjudicated by objective adjudicators from the broader Makhanda community who are experts in the respective entry categories. The adjudicators will provide each participant with comments and achievement certificates in bronze, silver, gold and double gold categories.

By entering, boys will be supporting their houses and the music department! They will support their houses in that each entry will earn 1 house point, while certificate awards will earn house points as follows: bronze - 2 points; silver - 5 points; gold - 7 points; double gold - 10 points. Which house will win the GC 2021 Eisteddfod? Boys will also support the music department's fundraising goals. An entry fee of R5 is payable at the school bursar and will serve as a fundraising event towards upgrades in the music department. We are saving up to increase the number of instruments so that instrumental musicianship can be included in the class music curriculum. We are also saving up towards sound-proofing our teaching and practise rooms, as well as for the general beautifying of our spaces.

#### JOKER POKER IS BACK!

All funds received go towards the 1st XI cricket tour costs in 2021.

To summarise, 52 playing cards plus a joker are shuffled and pinned face down on a board. Each week or fortnight, a raffle is held where supporters pay for the opportunity to possibly be the lucky winner who selects a single card from the board. The objective is to select the joker from the playing cards that are pinned faced down, and thereby win the grand prize. Part of the excitement and fun of Joker Poker is that after each unsuccessful card selection the prize jackpots and technically the odds improve with each draw as well. The prize will be carried over to the next draw if the Joker is not turned. Tickets are R10 per draw entry and you are allowed as many entries as you like in each draw. The prize is a percentage of all ticket sales and a 5000 litre Eco water tank donated by Eco Tanks and Buco, which is valued at R7000.
