Message from the Headmaster

Sadly, in recent weeks members of the Graeme College family have been rocked by the untimely passing of the following Old Graemians and/or Graeme College parents: Monwabisi Mdyesha (Matric 1999) [father of Xolisa in Grade 11], Xolisa Ntusi (Matric 1995) and Ayanda Kota [father of Sibalwethu in Grade 11]. Our thoughts and prayers are bestowed upon each of these families who are all experiencing a time of significant loss and mourning. We particularly stand with Xolisa and Sibalwethu, who have lost a pillar of strength in their lives at a young age. It reminds us that many of our boys carry trauma as part of their daily lives - and some of that trauma can be severe. How do we, as a community and family, assist boys who are dealing with trauma?

Firstly, we need to be present during times of difficulty. Making ourselves available - as staff, parents and boys - to Graemians who are struggling with trauma can have a significant impact. Let us give of our time to listen, comfort and stand beside these boys to provide the necessary support to them. Secondly, we need to be aware of others. Let us take time to hear the stories of boys who are part of our circle of influence - as staff, parents and boys - at Graeme College. There might be a particular boy that you see on a regular basis. Find time to hear (and listen to) the issues that trouble him the most and which might be holding him back in life. To this end, the high school has introduced the mentor system in the last couple of years. When a boy starts Grade 8, he is assigned a mentor teacher that will walk with him during his 5 years at the College. He will meet with his mentor teacher for 30 minutes every week, every single Monday as he journeys from Grade 8 to Grade 12. Graemians will hopefully develop a strong bond with their mentor teachers, during their 5 years at the College, that will help them navigate the turbulence and stresses of their adolescent years.

Let us stand strong together as a community as we face both the difficulties and joys that life brings us.

For this week, let us be conscious and caring towards those who might need us right now - and let us cherish life, which can be taken away so unexpectedly.



We are excited that every learner will have safe space to learn more about mental wellness, and reach out for help if needed, in a number of ways.

VIVE TEEN WELLNESS is an Artificial Intelligence enabled digital platform and smartphone application that was built in South Africa. The first version was launched earlier in 2023, with several schools presently using the full suite of functionality. The schools and learners that have been using the platform in recent months have provided us with very valuable feedback that assisted us in planning the next phase of the roll-out. During 2022 VIVE TEENS has been selected as a winner in the UpLink - World Economic Forum (WEF) Youth Mental Health Challenge where it has competed with over 120 other mental health companies from across the

The platform is expected to launch internationally early in 2024, and as part of that process we are awarding South African schools the opportunity to gain from a locally built application and support the mental wellness of our children.

The Graeme College subscription starts from 1 September 2023, but we would like our learners to download the application in the meantime, and familiarize themselves with it by referring to the various videos and guides.


