Message from the Deputy Headmaster

Earlier in the week, I had a reminder how easy it is for people to lose their way with regards to our competitive nature. Strangely enough, that evening the amazing story of Mutaz Essa Barshim and Gianmarco Tamber popped up on my screen again. As if I was being sent a reminder of what is really important, and what the true nature of sport is; especially in our country. And in our town. Those athletes gave such an incredible lesson and delivered such a powerful message - one that completely surpasses sport but talks to all human interaction, with respect being at the core of that message.

I remember watching the footage for the first time during the Tokyo Olympic Games, and was in such awe of the magnitude of what these incredible athletes chose to do.

In an unforgettable moment at the Tokyo Olympics, Mutaz Essa Barshim of Qatar and Gianmarco Tamberi of Italy offered the world a rare glimpse into the depths of human decency, respect and true sportsmanship. Both high jumpers reached the same height, an extraordinary feat in itself. Instead of continuing to compete, when officials offered a jump-off, Barshim asked if they could share the gold. Tamberi didn't hesitate, his emotions spilling over in joyful disbelief as the two champions embraced, united by a singular achievement in their sport and in humanity.

This moment resonates powerfully in a world that seems to be losing its grip on empathy and mutual respect. We live in times where competition often overshadows compassion and where individuals and organizations alike, frequently prioritize their interests above all else. Too often, the drive to win at any cost leaves no room for understanding, respect or shared accomplishment. We see it in workplaces and in businesses, where groups focus solely on profit margins and power. Even in personal interactions, the pervasive "me-first" attitude has distanced us from one another, and, in many ways, from ourselves.

But then, a story like Barshim and Tamberi's surfaces—a story where rivalry gave way to brotherhood, and where the pursuit of excellence coexisted with compassion. It was as though they stood not on a podium but on a higher moral ground, reminding the world that there is more to life than self-centered ambition. They reminded us that respect and understanding are the essence of sport, and, by extension of humanity itself. It's easy to be competitive, to feel the rush of trying to outdo others. But true greatness lies in knowing when to set aside personal gain and embrace the bigger picture. Barshim and Tamberi's decision to share the gold is a powerful lesson in humility and empathy. It teaches us that victory isn't always about being the best; sometimes, it's about sharing the best of ourselves with others. It's about standing in someone else's shoes, feeling their struggles and triumphs, and choosing to honour that shared journey over personal glory. Competition is essential, but so is compassion. It's a call to embrace the Olympic spirit in our daily lives, to find strength not in undermining others but in lifting them up, in reaching that summit together. In the face of this raw and genuine moment, we are reminded of the core values of the Olympics: friendship, respect, and excellence. Values that transcend sport and encompass the very essence of human nature. By sharing their gold, Barshim and Tamberi showed us that victory is sweetest when it's shared, that respect for one another is the highest achievement. Watch the video once more, and look at the joy in both of them... beating each other isn't important. The respect that they have for each other supersedes their own individual egos.

Teen App


We are delighted to announce that Graeme College has purchased a full membership of the VIVE TEEN WELLNESS application, which will enable ALL our learners to have full access to the app. It is something that we have thoroughly investigated, and feel that this is a massive step in the right direction for the wellbeing of our all learners. We are excited that every learner will have safe space to learn more about mental wellness, and reach out for help if needed, in a number of ways.

VIVE TEEN WELLNESS is an Artificial Intelligence enabled digital platform and smartphone application that was built in South Africa. The first version was launched earlier in 2023, with several schools presently using the full suite of functionality. The schools and learners that have been using the platform in recent months have provided us with very valuable feedback that assisted us in planning the next phase of the roll-out. During 2022 VIVE TEENS has been selected as a winner in the UpLink - World Economic Forum (WEF) Youth Mental Health Challenge where it has competed with over 120 other mental health companies from across the globe.

The platform is expected to launch internationally early in 2024, and as part of that process we are awarding South African schools the opportunity to gain from a locally built application and support the mental wellness of our children.

The Graeme College subscription starts from 1 September 2023, but we would like our learners to download the application in the meantime, and familiarise themselves with it by referring to the various videos and guides.
